# SIERRA NECK WARMER





## MATERIAL WE'LL BE USING FOR THIS PROJECT

- -Bulky weight yarn (60gr)
- -Tapestry needle
- -Scissors
- -Stitch marker(optional)

-7mm and 8mm crochet needle

## THE TYPE OF STITCHES YOU'LL NEED TO KNOW:

chain
slip stitch
yarn over slip stitch

### THE ABBREVIATIONS WE'LL USE:

CH - chain SS - slip stitch YO SS - yarn over slip stitch BLO - back loop only



### REMINDER


This neck warmer we'll make out of two parts which we will connect in the end

First part we'll make by crocheting the brim first Using 7mm needle

Start by making a slip knot and then chain 4

To make the first row turn your work and start crocheting in the second stitch from the needle





### Row 2: YO BLO in the next 3 stitches,

### CH1 turn your work

Row 3: YO SS BLO in 3 stitches

CH 1, turn your work

### Keep repeating this pattern until you get to the total of 44 rows



#### With the wrong side facing you, you'll connect the two parts with a slip stitch, 3 in total





#### Chain 1

Now we'll go on to making the body of the neck warmer using 8 mm needle

Row 1: Across you'll make YO SS in the first loop from the needle (as shown on the photo), then you'll continue with YO SS until you get to the 44 stitches in total.





Connect with a SS Chain 1 and turn your work

## Row 2: 44 YO SS BLO, connect with SS CH 1, turn your work











to the row 5 yarn

Repeat this pattern until you get to the row 5

### Cut your yarn leaving 15 cm of

Part 2: repeat the same pattern as we did in part 1 until you have a total of 6 rows

Cut the yarn leaving approximately 1 meter for connecting the two parts. Turn both parts inside out and tie the loose ends together

Then SS BLO the two parts together with the longer piece of yarn all the way around. Sew in the loose ends.
